Treasurer Kathryn Delaney reported the payment of show entry fees on Pay Pal is working smoothly. Her financial reports show a checking account balance of \$8,603.10, CD totals \$3,710.11, and \$336.98 in petty cash.

Reporting on the spring show, Janice said we have a full show of nearly 200 on-line entries. When entrants drop off their work on April 24, all the receipts and paper work will be completed in advance. Katey Sandy expressed her appreciation to the committee members and volunteers for all their work toward what looks to be a great show. Wanda Brewster thanked the members who contributed to 25 baskets with various themes for our silent auction. Rea Del Brashier asked that all sponsor awards be turned in today.

It was determined that the Bobbie Myers award would be members only choice and include all artwork at the show.

Janice thanked Diana Thewlis for her generous donation of a beautiful set of Time/Life art history books for a silent auction at our meeting.

On June 16th between 5:00 and 8:00 we're planning an artist's version of a wine-and-paint party at the Covington house. Bring your own paint, SWA will supply the refreshments and the subject but no instruction. More details to follow. This gathering may substitute for the summer picnic, unless someone wants to volunteer their yard.

Carolyn Macpherson was our featured member artist whose work is showing at several galleries. She is currently teaching watercolor classes at the Vancouver Art Space. She shared various watercolor pieces on paper and Yupo.

Our artist demonstrator, Threasa Weil who works in various mediums including ceramics, printmaking and found object boxes, demonstrated her technique on 3-D collage portraits.
