Speaking of: Pam Richey-Curtis

Pam Richey-Curtis is a long standing SWA member sitting on the Executive Board and heading up the Programs, Workshops, and venue committee. Pam is a local artist and the proprietor of Belle Flower Farm the supplier of those wonderful



bouquets and arrangements we see at our shows and the Cave Gallery. Pam's artistic talents were the inspiration for this month's exhibition at The Cave Gallery inspired by Belle Flower Farms showcasing plant matter. "All things natural will change with time, and we will observe these changes during the month of April." The show will run through April 30th, 10am – 4pm Tuesday through Saturday.

Belle Flower Farms hosts art workshops including a watercolor workshop May 6th (Bubbles and Blooms) and an Open Studio event on May 7th featuring another SWA member Sarah Lynn Hunter.

Now a little bit about Pam in her own words:

"I've always considered myself a worker bee buzzing around "Nature". From my time at what is now Portland Art Institute, I have enjoyed the hum of production—creating from behind the scenes. In the early years of my career I worked as a display artist, caterer, florist & merchandiser. During the whirl of raising our two sons, I continued to gather experiences that allowed for personal & professional growth—nurturing a passion for gardening, developing a successful Art Adventure program for Felida Elementary, annual Family Arts Nights, styling & florals for weddings & corporate events, writing articles showcasing local artists for an area magazine & sitting on the boards of SWA & CAN as Program Chair. I feel blessed to see the culmination of garnered skills & the support of those around me to see Belle Flower Farm a floral design & art workshop business become a reality. My favorite forms of medium are clayas a functional potter, watercolor & ink, and pastels. I also consider my floral design work & garden design to be a three dimensional art form".


