We are fortunate to have Peggy Patton heading up the Show Committee, and Janus Innes heading up the Gallery 360 venue curators. Watch for a couple of things coming your way: the first is the call for art for this year's Spring Show, (and, of course the call for volunteers

for the Spring Show), and the art exchanges occurring at the Gallery 360 venues (these happen at different times during the year and not all at once).

SWA will also step up and support the Vancouver Arts and Music Festival when the call goes out from CAN (Columbia Arts Network). The planning for this event is well underway. With CAN working with the City of Vancouver the event should be even better than last year. The festival is scheduled for August 1-4. Information will be forwarded as it is released from CAN and the City. The calls will include those for vendors as well as 2D, Photo/Digital, and 3D artists. It will be in same location as last year.

General Meeting, January 27



In addition to our general meeting, featuring news on the merger of MAA and SWA, Randall Vemer showed his film Musart, which is about his journey from music (as principle Viola in the Oregon Symphony) to painter. The film contains a series of his paintings of the various instruments in the orchestra, set to a score that was composed for this project by an Emmy Award winning composer. It was interesting to hear some of the background stories behind the paintings and the making of the film, The film has won Indie Film Awards world wide. Copies of the accompaning book, containing Haiku that was written for the project by published poet Christina Chin of Malaysia. were sold and signed and 100% of the proceeds went to SWA.

Randall drew some interesting corellations between film making and painting. He spoke of creating the storyline of a painting, just as a film maker creates a storyboard to map out the story of the film. He also compared casting a film, to choosing the figures in a painting and costuming to decide on the colors and styles of the clothing in your paintings. In his series of paintings, Randall contacted musicians in all parts of the world, working from photos and even staging photos with local musicians. Since he was planning this series of paintings during the pandemic, he found world renowned musicians more available to chat with him, which was immensely helpful and encouraging.

Another interesting fact, the composer wrote the score so that music by the instrument would be playing as the painting was shown of that instrument. While you imagine a symphony orchestra, plus a few other instruments, such as a pipe organ were needed! Actually, the composer synthesized the sound of the various instruments using a keybord and computer software.

Randall challenged us to find ways to expose the world to art in new and innovative ways. With the use of QR codes, we can link to our website, to short videos that explain our processes, and in the case of digital painting, to a video replay of each stroke made in the painting process. With today's technology we can do more than just hang a painting on the wall!

VETERANS ART SHOW

The Society of Washington Artists is scheduling a Veterans Art Show in the venue foyer at the United Church of Christ during the month of November, 2023. This will be a month long exhibition of art created by members of SWA, and other art groups, who have served in, or with our military.

The venue space will accommodate between 18-24 pieces of art. The Veterans show group will report to the SWA Show Coordinator and will be responsible for registering and then hanging their artwork.
