From Our President, Rick Jones



Welcome to 2024 and a new year. Not being 2023 is a great way to start out this year. No doubt, we are all very happy about 2023 fading into history. Last year was very trying, to say the least.

SWA did have a full year, however. Our meetings and demos were well received. The two seasonal shows were very successful. We suffered a huge loss with the passing of Angela Swanson. It's hard to describe just how devastating the loss of Angela was to not only SWA, but to the greater arts community in Clark County. As a result, we took a hard look at our Elected Officers and Committee Members organization and made some much-needed consolidation and streamlining of the Committees.

On the plus side of 2023, SWA was part of the mix for the first ever Vancouver Arts and Music Festival, which was held in August. On very short notice, CAN met the challenge of putting together the visual arts portion of the festival and the call for volunteers through the member groups of CAN, resulting in volunteers stepping forward to fill out the ranks.

Volunteers from SWA made up a large portion of the field force needed to make the festival a success. The talented and dedicated members of SWA provide a deep well of experience and definitely the spirit to get things done.

We were also very pleased to be able to welcome Mosiac Arts Alliance when they decided to disband and join SWA. This was a no-brainer, as not only are the Boards of the two groups interchangeable, but so are many of the members. A huge bonus to SWA was the ability to coordinate the two venues curated by Ed Martin with the three curated by MAA through Gallery 360. Gallery 360 will be headed up by Janus Innes and Debbie Morales and will coordinate the five venues in which our members' art is displayed, namely Elements Restaurant, The Hilton Hotel, United Church of Christ foyer, The Hall Building foyer, and the Third Congressional District Offices on Officer Row (the Perez Office). This essentially gives our members five venues in which they may display and sell their artwork. Watch for announcements from the curators about the placing of artwork, as each venue display has its own schedule. We are also continuing the very successful Artisan Holiday Market held in December.

We have also scheduled the Veterans' Art Show for the month of November, to be held in the UCC venue. We will be reaching out to our veterans to lend a hand in organizing and setting up the venue, so be on the lookout for additional information about this event coming your way.

As we move into 2024, we would like to reach out to members, especially those new to SWA, to ask if you would lend your expertise and talents in areas where they are much needed. Specifically, we would like to add you to our Show Planning and program planning committees. *continued on page 2*


